



Christmas in Bethelby Richard Paul Evans

Leigh Beth Stilton is saved by a book and when she meets the author, she is smitten. Initially, he's perfect, then he lies. Is he just as bad as everyone else?




Bellevue by Robin Cook

Mitt Fuller is just starting his surgical residency when he begins seeing visions in the psychopathic building that might tank his career and his life.




<u>Lawbreaker</u> by Diana Palmer



Dahlia de Beaumont runs a perfume business based in Paris, but, while on a business trip to San Francisco, is trapped by brush fires in Napa Valley.




The Mirror by Nora Roberts

Sonya MacTavish inherits a Victorian mansion, having no idea that a centuries-old family curse involving murdered brides must be broken.





Dream interpreters and shadows detachers weave through a love story, a quest, and an ode to books and libraries.




The Serviceberry by Robin Wall Kimmerer
