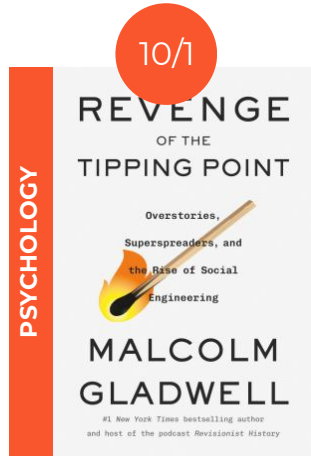

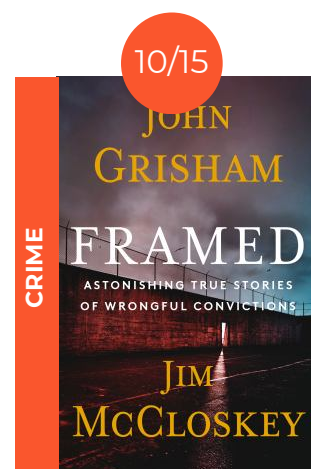
An Eye for an Eye

Lord Hartley, the latest in a line going back two hundred years, lies dying. But his will triggers an inheritance with explosive consequences.



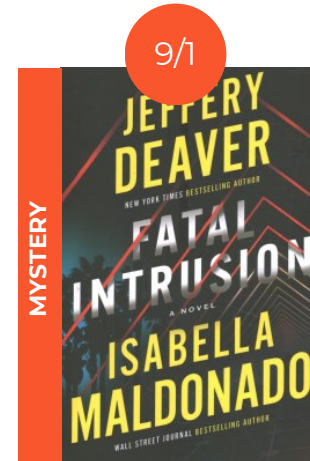
Lies He Told Me

This sequel details social epidemics, this time with the aim of explaining the dark side of contagious phenomena.



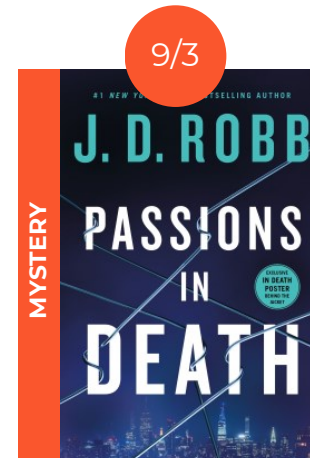
Framed

Over seventy-two gripping hours, a detective and a professor find themselves amidst a lethal chess match with a killer.



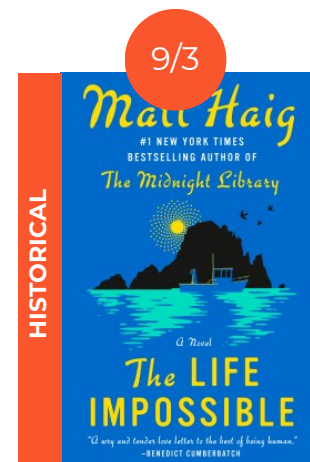
On the Hunt

Bold new heroine, Kira Drake, along with her search and rescue dog, begin an international search for an elusive killer.



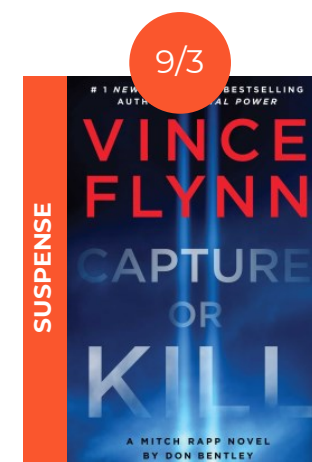
Passions in Death

When Iran presents a nuclear demonstration, one man must stop a new war from destroying the Middle East, and maybe the world.

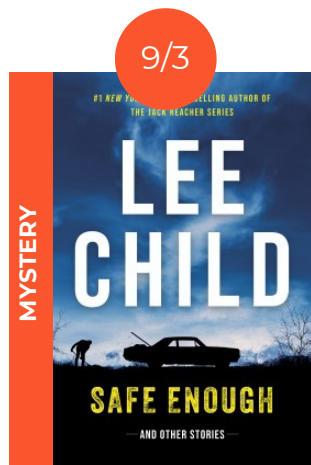

by Benjamin Netanyahu

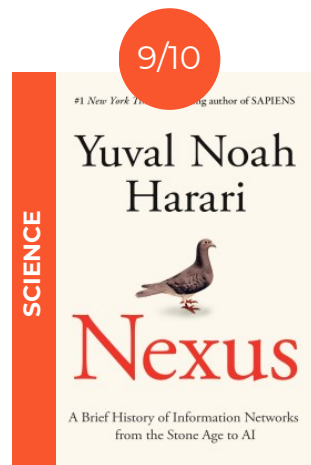

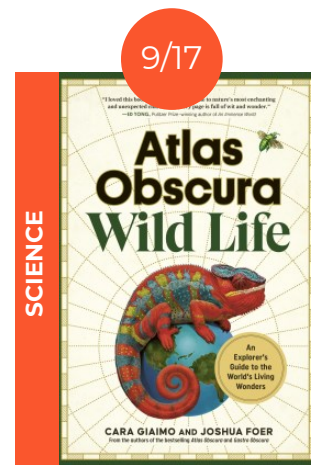

A revealing account of what it's like to be a woman in TV news, filled with colorful tales of rivalry, triumph, and how serious reporting and tabloid journalism became blurred.



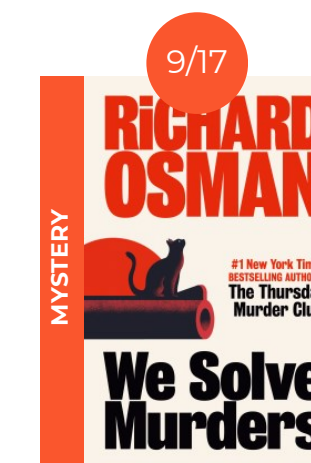
Somewhere Beyond the Sea by T. J. Klune

A chronicle of the generations-long fight for tribal land and sovereignty in eastern Oklahoma.



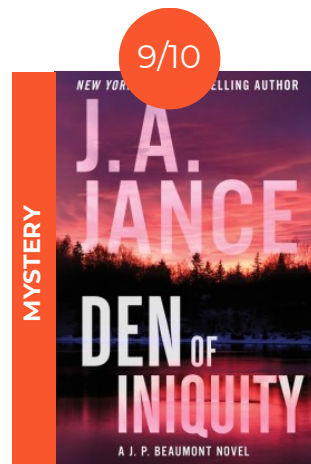
The Night We Lost Him

When the patriarch of a famed hotel empire dies suspiciously, his daughter and her estranged brother join forces to unravel who he really was.



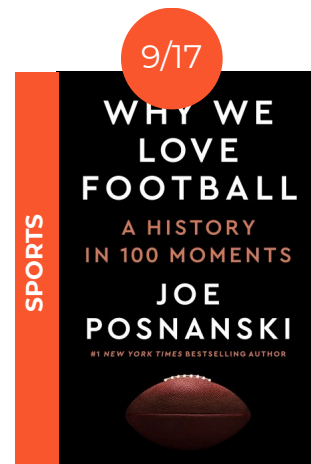
We Solve Murders

What appears to be an overdose quickly leads private investigator J. P. Beaumont to uncover similar mysterious deaths that all point to a most unlikely suspect.



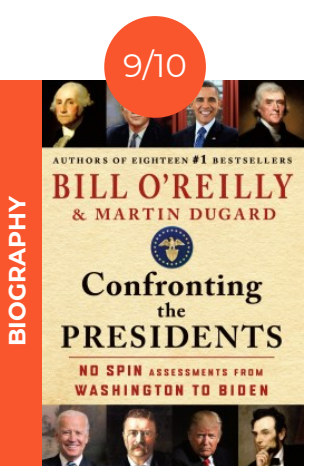
Why We Love Football

From hidden gems and classic tales to famous moments told from previously unheard perspectives, this book offers fun accounts for even the most ardent fans.



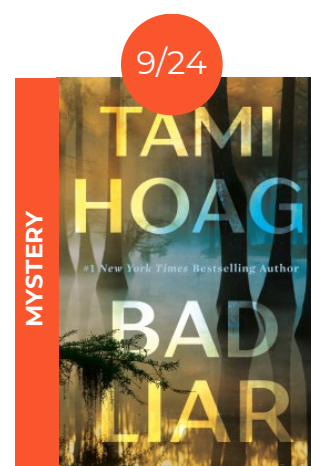
Counting Miracles

Tanner Hughes has spent his life as a rolling stone, but when his dying grandmother gives him instructions on where to find his long-lost father, he must come home.



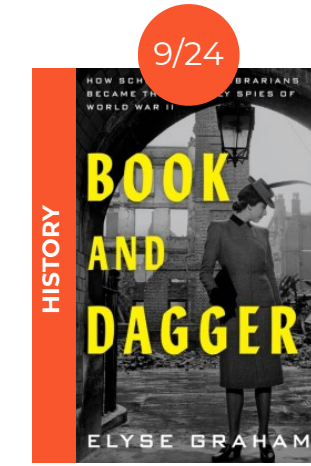
Here One Moment
